

Omaha to be a lot more clear-cut and mathematical game than Hold'em

For this cause, Omaha/8 tends to have fewer short-term variations (fortune) than Hold'em. Lots of players enjoy playing Omaha/8 more than Hold'em for the reason that of the reduced variation. The difficulty is it can occasionally be hard to locate a good Omaha/8 game, but there never looks to be a lack of Hold'em games.

The Cards Speak rule applies in Omaha poker. If a player wrongly verbally declares a wrong denomination of a hand, it does not subject what the player says. The casino dealer should read what the real denomination of a player's hand is.
